

Call for Oral Presentation and Poster Abstracts
7th Native Prairie Restoration/Reclamation Workshop
and 5th Transboundary Grasslands Workshop

Ramada Plaza, Regina, SK
February 25-27, 2020

The 7th Native Prairie Restoration/Reclamation Workshop and 5th Transboundary Grasslands Workshop will occur in Regina, SK from February 25-27, 2020. The Workshop will include oral presentations, case studies, panel discussion, tradeshow and poster session.

The theme for the workshop is ***The Big Picture: Planning and Partnerships***. Presentation or poster abstracts that include some aspect of planning for restoration/reclamation projects or an example of successful partnerships are especially invited to submit abstracts for this event.

Concurrent session presentations will be 20-25 minutes long and will include 5 minutes for questions from the audience. Concurrent sessions will be organized by topic and presenters will be notified about their scheduled time in December. Audience participants include government, environmental non-profit organizations, industry, research and academic institutions, environmental consultants, land managers, agriculture and more.

Poster authors will need to bring a printed version of their poster to display at the workshop. The posters could potentially be visible for the duration of the joint workshop, or 3 days. Presenting work as posters, allows authors to interact with attendees and discuss their research at length. Authors are requested to be available to discuss their posters during the designated poster session.

Instructions for Submitting Presentation Abstracts

The submission deadline for oral presentation abstracts is **September 30, 2019 at 11:59 pm CST**. Abstracts must be under 250 words, and should include a statement of objectives, brief description of methods, results, lessons learned and conclusions. Projects need to pertain to native prairie restoration or reclamation. Do not include presentation/poster title or author information in the abstract. For presentation abstracts, please indicate if the presentation fits within one of the following subject categories:

- Tools to Restore/Reclaim Native Prairie
- Planning to minimize impact to Native Prairie
- Planning for a Species Reintroduction
- Prescribed Fire as a Management Option
- Integrated Pest Management Plan
- Soils and Mycorrhizae
- Ecosystem Management
- Transboundary Partnerships
- Native Seeds

- Urban Restoration Projects
- Wetland Restoration Projects

Presentation Abstract Evaluation

Abstracts will be evaluated based on how well they fit the presentation criteria, the subject categories and with the other presentations. Presentations should present results from completed projects or completed phases of long-term projects or early phases of innovative methods.

All abstracts will be reviewed by at least two reviewers. Please be advised that not all abstracts will be chosen, even if they meet the criteria. Notice of decision will be made by November 1, 2019 via email.

Instructions for Submitting Poster Abstracts

The poster abstract submission deadline is **December 1, 2019 at 11:59 CST**. Abstracts must be under 250 words, and should include a statement of objectives, brief description of methods, results, lessons learned and conclusions. Projects will need to relate to native prairie restoration or reclamation or transboundary issues. If unsure if your poster would be suitable, please contact Caitlin. For poster abstracts, a subject category does not need to be specified. Posters can be in the beginning phases of projects, project plans, or student projects. Notice of decision will be made by December 15, 2019 via email.
